Ben Barnes

Ben Barnes is the founding Artistic Director of Four Rivers which is dedicated to developing new and established work in and for the South East. He is a former Artistic Director of Opera Theatre Company and the Abbey Theatre. His award-winning productions have been seen in major cities all over the world and his most recent credits include an American production of **The Crucible** and **Madama Butterfly** for Irish National Opera at the BGE theatre. He recently directed a rehearsed reading of **More Stately Mansions** for the Eugene O'Neill Festival and **The Beauty Queen of Leenane** by Martin McDonagh for Four Rivers on tour. Earlier this year he directed readings of eight new Wexford plays and previously directed for **WexFour**, **My Real Life** and **The Scourge** all for the Wexford Arts Centre.

Mae Leahy

Mae is a costume designer and director based between Waterford and Dublin. She recently graduated from Trinity College with a degree in Drama and Theatre Studies. Mae is a founding member of Gift Horse Theatre, and recently designed their production of Twelfth Night, which toured the country. Other design credits include Grianstad (DU Players), Divine, Supermoon, Boom!, The Strangest Kind of Romance, Looking Deadly, The Epiphany of Eileen O Keefe (TCD Debut Festival), When I Was Young I Never Talked to Clouds, Salvatore DeWonderful: LIVE! From the Copacabana (Scene and Heard) and Tess (Gift Horse Theatre). Mae was an active member of DU Players, designing over 30 shows and events from 2017-2020 including the Freshers Co-Op. She was elected Wardrobe and Basement Manager 2019/2020. Mae also works with Waterford Spraoi as a makeup designer and costume assist.

Mark Redmond

Mark has been involved with theatre since 1982 when he started with Wexford Pantomime Society. He is a founder member of Oyster Lane Theatre Group. Over the years he has moved from an initial interest in lighting to include set design and construction in his portfolio.

Over the years Mark has worked with Billy Roche on several productions, including **Amphibians, Lay me Down Softly** and **Of Mornington** - Scalders Theatre company. More recently Mark was back on the road again with a new work Roche work, **The Diary of Maynard Perdu** - an adaptation of the novella to a one man show with actor Pete McCamley. Besides runs at the Wexford Arts Centre the piece has been performed in Dublin's Smock Alley, and The Mill Theatre in Dundrum. Also as part of the Eugene O'Neill festival in New Ross.

One of his proudest achievements has been working on Billy Roche's **Tales From Rainwater Pond** including the original production at Wexford Arts Centre, on tour in Ireland and in New York as part of the 2009 1st Irish Festival.

Also in more recent credits, include the set design for Wexford Arts Centre's production of Michelle Dooley Mahon's play **Scourged**, which has toured in Ireland and which will be staged in New York sometime in the next year.

Over the years Mark has gained AIMS nominations in the best technical category with Enniscorthy Musical Societies' productions of Jesus Christ Superstar and Fiddler on the Roof, with OLTG for Beauty and the Beast and with Gorey Musical Society for All Shook Up. In the past year Mark has won a best technical award at AIMS for the EMS production of Sister Act and was proud to be a part of the production team for OLTG's All Ireland winning Michael Collins a Musical Drama.

On his time working on the drama circuit with Wexford Drama Group Mark has received numerous best set awards for productions including **The Mai, Someone to Watch over me**, **Holy Day, Doubt** and the national finalist challenger **The Bog of Cats** (which was nominated for Best Set at the All Ireland).
